Site activity update – Monday 15 to Friday 26 November 2021 Covid-19 site safety

Lendlease operates the Tweed Valley Hospital site in accordance with all directives from the NSW Government and Chief Health Officer. We will continue to monitor the situation and will respond to all directives from the NSW Government and Chief Health Officer should the situation change, including changes to QLD/NSW border restrictions.

Construction activities

The following activities will take place over the next two weeks, weather permitting:

- Continued concrete pours on Levels 3 and 4 with approximately seven slabs scheduled to be poured in the coming fortnight. Approximately 60% of the hospital structure is now completed.
- Concrete pours for the Eastern and Western central cores up to Level 6.
- Two vertical pours for the LINAC bunker's western walls.
- An additional car park on the eastern side of the site for visitor and additional workforce parking is now open with entry via the Turnock Street roundabout.
- Continued delivery and installation of precast façade panels to the Mental Health and Emergency areas of the hospital building.
- Ongoing installation of services at the basement and lower ground levels, including ducts, electrical, water pipes, and wall and ceiling framing.
- Ongoing work for the switching (power) station on the western side of site.
- Ongoing works for the permanent power installation with traffic control in place along Cudgen Road near the work site.
- Works to upgrade and widen an approximately 400m section of Cudgen Road will commence from 15 November. Please see attached notification for further details on the sequencing of the upcoming works.

What to expect during construction?

- Concrete and formwork delivery trucks entering and exiting site.
- Increased activity and workers on site.
- Standard construction hours are Mon-Fri 6am-6pm, and Sat 6am-6pm.
- Some noise, dust or vibrations may occur from these activities. Monitoring controls are in place to maintain levels within permissible limits.

TWEED VALLEY HOSPITAL PROJECT NOVEMBER 2021



WORKS NOTIFICATION

The NSW Government is investing \$723.3 million in health for the Tweed-Byron region, which includes construction of the new Tweed Valley Hospital. Health Infrastructure NSW has engaged Lendlease to construct the main hospital buildings. The new hospital is on track to open to patients in 2023.

Cudgen Road upgrade works from 15 November 2021

As part of the Tweed Valley Hospital project, a section of Cudgen Road will be upgraded to accommodate vehicles entering and exiting the new hospital. The upgrade will include widening a section of Cudgen Road from two lanes to four lanes, a realigned footpath on the road's northern side, new slip lanes, bus stops and a new signalised intersection at the hospital's main entry. The works will take approximately one year to complete and will be undertaken in four stages:

- **Stage one:** Construction of a temporary footpath on the northern side of Cudgen Road within the hospital boundary to replace the current footpath.
- **Stage two:** Construction of the new signalised intersection at the hospital's main entry.
- **Stage three:** Widening of the eastbound lane to two lanes, including additional street lighting and services installation, with traffic switched to the southern side of Cudgen Road.
- **Stage four:** Widening of the westbound lane to two lanes, including additional street lighting and services installation, with traffic switched to the northern side of Cudgen Road.

What to expect:

- Road works to be undertaken on Cudgen Road from November 2021 to late 2022.
- Reduced speed limit on Cudgen Road in the vicinity of the works.
- Relocation of the two existing bus stops along Cudgen Road.
- Vegetation removal within the hospital site boundary.
- Traffic control in place during certain activities for the safety of motorists and pedestrians.
- Periodic lane closures, footpath changes and bus stop relocations.
- Access will be maintained however motorists may experience delays during certain activities.
- If any major traffic changes are required, specific notifications will be provided ahead of these changes.

Summary of discussions in breakout rooms

Aboriginal Education Team

- Timing of meetings consider alternate meeting times
- Need for reflection on why the school required an evaluation
- Number of people in team? Too many?
- Purpose of team what does it look like in practice?
- Professional learning should include ACLO and Aboriginal Education and Wellbeing Officer Belinda Standage. Workshops with parents, teachers and students.
- Cultural safety and appropriate cultural protocols
- Teaching staff to understand racism
- Strengthening processes around dealing with racism
- Teaching students strategies to be able to counter racism.
- Teaching all kids about racism
- Student voice, agency, leadership and empowerment strengthening student identity
- Building cultural relationships and history of school recognising the long standing relationship and history between the Aboriginal community and KHS. Should be known by all students and staff.
- Governance structure required to ensure voices do not get lost.

Professional Learning and Cultural Competence

- Need for understanding of cultural safety all staff practicing cultural safety including students and Aboriginal staff
- Cultural awareness for all staff
- Staff induction required understanding the culture of the area
- Support for Aboriginal staff
- Personalised Learning Pathways are important for individual student direction and support.
- Lifting the confidence of staff across all school through PL
- AECG/Department of Education Partnership Agreement
- Connecting to Country access limited by opportunity. Very important PL. Incorporating culture into curriculum
- Anti-Racism training for ALL teachers
- Aboriginal pedagogies (8 Ways) underpins everything. How Aboriginal and Torres Strait Island kids learn – hand in hand with PLPs
- Welcome to Country/Acknowledgement starting point
- Aboriginal Education Policy
- Aboriginal Histories and Cultures and Torres Strait Island and South Sea Islander PL embed knowledge for utilisation within the school include Aboriginal Education as a part of day to day learning for all students.

Student and Community Partnerships

- Older students encouraging/mentoring younger students to become involved role models
- Utilise leaders across all cohorts increases sense of belonging in the school, involves all
- Regular student meetings where possible student voice
- Nothing about us without us with Aboriginal peoples, for Aboriginal peoples, by Aboriginal peoples
- Non Indigenous student involvement in learning with their Indigenous peers
- Brining advocacy/ideas from community into the school through the students and conversations they have at home.
- Conversations with students knowing their voices are being heard.
- Jnr AECG in theory sounds great but is a lot of work
- Attach Jnr AECG to Yuli or Beyond Broncos programs. Yuli hugely beneficial in terms of mentoring, building confidence, increases commitment become mentors in future.
- Better communication with students and parents assist connection to school.
- PLPs not completed would have assisted with better communication.
