### NAIDOC WEEK AT KINGSCLIFF HIGH SCHOOL

Across our country, the first week in July is set aside to commemorate the work begun by the National Aborigines and Islanders Day Observance Committee (NAIDOC) in what has become known as NAIDOC Week. Because this significant event in our national calendar falls during the winter school holidays, our school celebrates NAIDOC Week during the last week of Term 2.

With many thanks to members of our Aboriginal community and our Aboriginal Education Team here at school, the theme of "Get Up, Stand Up, Show Up" has been well and truly on display at our school this week. During our whole school assembly on Monday morning, Uncle Victor Slookee welcomed us all to Country, Ernie Williams led us through a powerful smoking ceremony and Leween Williams, President of the Tweed Wollumbin Lands Council, and a former student, delivered the keynote speech.

In addition, we were able to recognise our most recent addition to our Kingscliff High School Indigenous Wall of Fame, Mr Lucas Proudfoot, who graduated from our school in 1997 and went on to achieve great success as a performer and author for early childhood audiences, building understanding of and engagement with First Nations cultural perspectives.

### STUDENT PERFORMANCE EVENINGS – WINTER COLLECTIVE

It has been wonderful to see the return of these evenings after the disruption caused by the COVID Pandemic. Our dedicated CAPA teachers have been working with very excited and equally dedicated students to produce a night of music on Tuesday, dance on Wednesday and drama on Thursday. Performances on each night begin at 7:00pm in our MPU.

I would again like to confirm that, despite the Teacher's Strike on Thursday, the Drama Evening will go ahead on Thursday as planned. I would like to thank the CAPA teachers for their dedication in ensuring the night goes ahead as planned.

## KINGSLIFF HIGH SCHOOL CELEBRATES NAIDOC WEEK

On Monday 27 June, we held our NAIDOC Opening Ceremony at a full school assembly. We were honoured to have parents and community in attendance including elders, **Aunty Dale Williams**, **Uncle Victor Slockee** and **Uncle Robert Smallwood**.

The ceremony began with a beautiful Welcome to Country by **Uncle Victor Slockee** who explained the significance of the land on which we work and learn each day and the importance of caring and respecting this country.



Our students were also treated to a traditional Smoking Ceremony conducted and explained by countryman **Ernie Williams** followed by a powerful speech by CEO of the Tweed Byron Local Aboriginal Lands Council, **Leweena Williams** on the significance of NAIDOC and this year's theme **Get Up! Stand Up! Show Up!**



Each year at this ceremony, we recognise and celebrate a former Aboriginal or Torres Strait Islander student and/or staff member who has achieved excellence in one or more of four categories. This person is inducted into our Wall of Fame which is proudly displayed in our school library.

We are very, very proud to announce our 2022 Wall of Fame recipient is **Lucas Proudfoot** who attended Kingscliff High School from 1992 – 1997. Amongst many achievements including being an internationally acclaimed surfer, Lucas has carved out an impressive career as an author and entertainer, performing on ABC Play School and with other children's entertainers such as Hi5, Justine Clark and Yo Gabba Gabba. He tours Australia and the world performing his contemporary cultural show Circular Rhythm to over 100,000 students across each year. His outstanding contribution to cultural inclusion and education. The traditional flag raising ceremony was proudly carried out by Year 11 students **Jack Stavleu** and **Kobi McIntosh** before a lovely morning tea for Elders, parents and community members assisted by Year 11 students, **Isabella Whitehead** and **Chelsea Overall**. A great day was finished off for the kids with a BBQ with a playlist of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander music.

Our staff then finished the day with some Professional Learning after school on 'Connecting with Aboriginal Students, Families and Communities' delivered by Aboriginal Education and Wellbeing Officer, **Belinda Standage** and

Aboriginal Community Liaison Officer, **Tracy Mackenzie**.

The rest of the week includes a variety of activities including an Artefacts display and information session conducted by **Warren Phillips** and **Ernie Williams**, a Yarn Up for all Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander students down at the Cudgen Creek reserve, Wear the Colours Mufti Day, and some of our students are visiting the primary school to conduct an Indigenous Games activity.





## YEAR 7 POD

A group of Year 7 students participated in the ISTEM Recycling and Flood Relief Challenge. The students had to use recycle material to design a sustainable product that could be used by the local community post the flood. Some examples included wood pallet day bed, table tennis table and odour repair plants.

- the Arts
- Sport
- Business/Public Service
- Academia

This person is inducted into our Wall of Fame which is proudly displayed in our school library.

Our recipient today is a proud member of the Tweed Coast Aboriginal and Islander community. He attended Kingscliff High School from 1992 to 1997 and is remembered for his energy, enthusiasm and charismatic personality. He was an impressive allrounder, loved his sport and was good at it! A great footballer and athlete, representing his school and community at State level. He is also an internationally acclaimed professional surfer.

Today, and for the last 20 years, his work has taken him around our country and indeed the world as a talented multi platform storyteller, sharing stories through his music, books, live performances and TV appearances. He performs his contemporary cultural show, Circular Rhythm, using guitar, didgeridoo and the stomp box, to over 100 000 kids each year. We indeed have had the great privilege of him delivering his entertaining contemporary Indigenous Australian music experience recently at our school.

He has a long list of achievements which include:

- being an ambassador for the [Australian Literacy & Numeracy Foundation](#), 'ALNF'
- being a special guest on Australia's favourite children's program *ABC Play School*, where he performed four original songs as part of the program's 'Music in Me' series
- performing over 250+ live shows every year
- being a published author of a five-part book series titled [The Proud Foots](#), with one of Australia's leading education publishers
- Headline and guest appearances at a number of writers' festivals including the Sydney Writers' Festival, Brisbane Writers Festival, Byron Writers Festival, Whitsundays Voices Literature Festival, Kimberly Writers Festival and Somerset Storyfest, Australia's premier youth literature festival based in Queensland
- Sharing the stage with a host of Australia's most renowned children performers including Hi5, Justine Clarke, ay Laga'aia and Yo Gabba.
