Australian Virtual Astronaut Challenge

This week 2 teams of students (Year 7 and Year 10) have started the Australian Virtual Astronaut Challenge and will complete a 9-week STEM design sprint based on challenges facing NASA's Artemis and the Australian space industry. These AVA teams will choose from a set of four scenarios and design a solution presented in the form of either a 90 second video pitch or poster. The Year 10 team will have the opportunity to be selected to pitch their ideas at the Young Space Explorers event on 2nd December in Sydney!

The teams are to select one of the following scenarios and complete the mission objectives for that scenario:

- * Earth Observation: Milo Institute The University of Arizona
- * Robotics: Trailblazer The Australian Space Agency
- * Home on the Moon: Aldrin Family Foundation
- * Growing Food in Space: Magnitude.io

Each week the teams will meet with their teacher to undertake the weekly challenge to achieve their mission's objectives using the iSTEM Engineering Design Process. The challenges also include the opportunity to connect with Australian Space Agency and NASA personnel and other scientists who are currently researching the scenarios above.

The AVA will end Friday 11 November when each team will have to submit their video pitch or poster. We wish the teams all the best and sincerely thank Mr Jovaisa for assisting and supporting the teams in their Virtual Astronaut Challenge.





Curious Minds

Do you have a curious mind? If you're a girl in year 9 or 10 who is passionate about STEM subjects this may be the experience for you. **Curious Minds** (run by Australian Science Innovations and the Australian Maths Trust) empowers girls who are passionate, high performers in Science, Technology, Engineering, and Mathematics (STEM) to explore their full potential, through a six-month hands-on extension and mentoring program.

There are two residential camps and a mentoring program for girls in years 9 and 10 who have limited opportunities because of where they live, including regional and remote locations, their socio-economic background, and/or their indigenous status.

In a fun and supportive environment, you have the opportunity to grow in confidence and ability whilst expanding your critical thinking and problem-solving skills, and your scientific networks. You will be exposed to outstanding role models, practise new skills, and deepen your understanding of what their future may hold in the fields of STEM.

Families have already received information on creating a parent portal account. Please contact the school if you have not received parent portal creation information. If you do not have access to the internet, bookings can still be made by your child with their teacher.

If you are not making online bookings, your child should confirm with you the times when you can make it. Students then make bookings with their teacher for times that suit. Those who get their bookings done early are more likely to get the time slots that their parents prefer.



Tweed Valley Hospital Project

Site activity update –Monday 29 August to Friday 9 September 2022

Construction activities

The following activities will take place over the next two weeks, weather permitting:

Works for the main hospital buildings:

- Structural steel installation for internal and external awnings.
- Ongoing fit-out activities up to Level 5, including services, walls, partitions, ceilings, painting and flooring.
- Continued delivery and installation of precast façade panels, with 75% precast panels and 66% mega panels now installed.
- Ongoing work for the switching (power) station and water tanks on the western side of site.

Works on Cudgen Road:

- Ongoing work for the new eastbound Cudgen Road lanes including concreting, footpath construction, placement and compaction of fill and a seal on top of the new lanes.
- No traffic changes anticipated in the coming fortnight.

What to expect during construction?

- Ongoing regular construction vehicles entering and exiting site.
- Standard construction hours are Mon-Fri 7am-6pm, and Sat 8am-1pm.
- Some noise, dust or vibrations may occur from these activities. Monitoring controls are in place to maintain levels within permissible limits.

Compulsory school attendance

Information for parents

Education for your child is important and regular attendance at school is essential for your child to achieve their educational best and increase their career and life options. NSW public schools work in partnership with parents to encourage and support regular attendance of children and young people. When your child attends school every day, learning becomes easier and your child will build and maintain friendships with other children.

What are my Legal responsibilities?

Education in New South Wales is compulsory for all children between the ages of six years and below the minimum school leaving age of 17 years. The Education Act 1990 requires that parents ensure their children of compulsory school age are enrolled at, and regularly attend school, or, are registered with the NSW Education and Standards Authority for home schooling.

Once enrolled, children are required to attend school each day it is open for students.

The Importance of arriving on time

Arriving at school and class on time:

- Ensures that students do not miss out on important learning activities scheduled early in the day
- Helps students learn the importance of punctuality and routine
- Give students time to greet their friends before class
- Reduces classroom disruption

Lateness is recorded as a partial absence and must be explained by parents.

What if my child has to be away from school?

On occasion, your child may need to be absent from school. Justified reasons for student absences may include:

- being sick, or having an infectious disease
- having an unavoidable medical appointment
- being required to attend a recognised religious holiday
- exceptional or urgent family circumstance (e.g. attending a funeral)



Following an absence from school you must ensure that within 7 days you provide your child's school with a verbal or written explanation for the absence. However, if the school has not received an explanation from you within 2 days, the school may contact you to discuss the absence.

Principals may decline to accept an explanation that you have provided if they do not believe the absence is in the best interest of your child. In these circumstances your child's absence would be recorded as unjustified. When this happens the principal will discuss their decision with you and the reasons why.

Principals may request medical certificates or other documentation when frequent or long term absences are explained as being due to illness. Principals may also seek parental permission to speak with medical specialists to obtain information to collaboratively develop a health care plan to support your child. If the request is denied, the principal can record the absences as unjustified.

Travel

Families are encouraged to travel during school holidays. If travel during school term is necessary, discuss this with your child's school principal. An Application for Extended Leave may need to be completed. Absences relating to travel will be marked as leave on the roll and therefore contribute to your child's total absences for the year.

In some circumstances students may be eligible to enrol in distance education for travel periods over 50 school days. This should be discussed with your child's school principal.

My child won't go to school what should I do?

You should contact the principal as soon as possible to discuss the issue and ask for help. Strategies to help improve attendance may include a referral to the school's learning and support team or linking your child with appropriate support networks. The principal may seek further support from the Home School Liaison Program to develop an Attendance Improvement Plan.

What might happen if my child continues to have unacceptable absences?

It is important to understand that the Department of Education may be required to take further action where children of compulsory school age have recurring numbers of unexplained or unjustified absences from school. Some of the following actions may be undertaken:

Compulsory Schooling Conferences

You may be asked, along with your child, to attend a Compulsory Schooling Conference. The conference will help to identify the supports your child may need to have in place so they attend school regularly. The school, parents and agencies will work together to develop an agreed plan (known as Undertakings) to support your child's attendance at school.

• Application to the Children's Court – Compulsory Schooling Order

If your child's attendance at school remains unsatisfactory the Department may apply to the Children's Court for a Compulsory Schooling Order. The Children's Court magistrate may order a Compulsory Schooling Conference to be convened.

• Prosecution in the Local Court

School and Department staff remain committed to working in partnership with you to address the issues which are preventing your child's full participation at school. In circumstances where a breach of compulsory schooling orders occurs further action may be taken against a parent in the Local Court. The result of court action can be the imposition of a community service order or a fine.

What age can my child leave school?

All New South Wales students must complete Year 10 or its equivalent. After Year 10, and up until they reach 17 years of age, there are a range of flexible options for students to complete their schooling.

Working in Partnership

The NSW Department of Education recognises that working collaboratively with students and their families is the best way to support the regular attendance of students at school.
