NAPLAN & HSC Minimum Standards

This week, many of our students will be involved in literacy and numeracy skills testing which will contribute to the ongoing body of student learning data, which informs what we are doing to improve student learning outcomes at Kingscliff High School. On Tuesday, Year 10 students will take part in HSC Minimum Standards testing, while some Years 11 and 12 students will also undertake testing on Wednesday. Students are required to meet HSC Minimum Standards in order to be eligible for the HSC. On Thursday and Friday Years 7 and 9 will undertake NAPLAN testing, where the intention is to take a diagnostic snapshot of literacy and numeracy skills.

All students are encouraged to perform to the best of their ability during the above testing. Many thanks to Mr Torok for his coordination.

Kingscliff High School is hosting an information night for all prospective parents from Kindergarten to Year 6. For more details about this, a flyer has been attached further in this newsletter.




Harmony Week

Dear Parents / Caregivers

Parent Teacher interviews for 11 and 12 students will be held on Tuesday 28 March from 3.30pm until 6.30pm.

You are invited to attend these interviews. Children are best educated through positive communication and partnerships between parents and schools. Parent teacher interviews provide an excellent opportunity for open discussion on issues affecting your child.

To make Parent Teacher night more accessible, **bookings** with your child's teachers can be made **online in the parent portal**. A link can be found on the **school's website** to the Parent Portal. Families have already received information on creating a parent portal account. Please contact the school if you have not received parent portal creation information. If you do not have access to the internet, bookings can still be made by your child with their teacher.

If you are **not** making online bookings, your child should confirm with you the times when you can make it. Students then make bookings with their teacher for times that suit. Those who get their bookings done early are more likely to get the time slots that their parents prefer.

Please keep interviews to no more than five minutes, otherwise it will be impossible for all parents to see the teachers with whom they wish to have an interview.

If a teacher is unavailable on the day for any reason, a phone call to the school can be made to arrange a special or longer interview if required.






Open Girls Netball








U14 Girls League Tag

Tweed Valley Hospital Project

Site activity update – Monday 13 to Friday 24 March 2023

Construction activities

The following activities will take place over the next two weeks, weather permitting:

Works for the main hospital buildings:

- Ongoing fit-out activities on all levels, including services, walls, partitions, ceilings, painting and flooring.
- With the façade now 99% complete, the final windows at the Main Entry will continue to be installed.
- Civil works for the new main entry road within the site boundary.
- Ongoing work for the switching (power) station and water tanks on the western side of site.

Works on Cudgen Road:

- Installation of new storm water pipes and other services will be ongoing on the southern side of Cudgen Road.
- Barrier movements on the southern side of Cudgen Road over the next fortnight will take place and will require stop/go traffic control. Motorists may experience short delays during this time.
- Please observe all signage directions and speed limits when travelling on Cudgen Road.

What to expect during construction

- Intermittent stop/go traffic arrangements on Cudgen Road over the next fortnight. Access will be maintained however motorists may experience short delays.
- Ongoing regular construction vehicles entering and exiting site.
- Standard construction hours are Mon-Fri 7am-6pm, and Sat 8am-1pm.
- Some noise, dust or vibrations may occur from these activities. Monitoring controls
 are in place to maintain levels within permissible limits.
