## Sport and Physical Activity – Wednesday afternoon Sport

Our students are regularly reminded that attendance at Wednesday afternoon Sport is compulsory for Years 7–10. It is a mandatory component for the Record of School Achievement (ROSA), the NSW Education Standards Authority (NESA) credential awarded at the end of Year 10.

Consistent sport absences will result in a warning letter being sent and could jeopardise the attainment of a ROSA. Wednesday sport is not an appropriate time to arrange regular appointments. If students are signing out during sport time they will be required to bring a note to explain this absence. This note will need to contain the following:

- student's name
- the specific reason for leaving school early (ie. not just appointment or family business)
- the time when departing
- who is picking the student up
- a contact name and telephone number

The note will need to be signed by the Sport Organiser, before roll call or at recess at the latest. Parents arriving at the Front Office to collect their child will be required to fill out a *'Permission to sign out early'* form and have it signed by the Sport Organiser. Students who repeatedly attempt to sign out of school on Wednesday afternoons will be referred to the Deputy Principal.

## CONSEQUENCES FOR BREACHING EXAM RULES:

- 1. General warning is the final warning
- 2. First personal warning will result in the loss of 20% of exam marks and will be noted on the exam paper (unless the infraction was cheating or using a mobile phone in which case a zero mark for that exam will be recorded)
- 3. Second personal warning will result in receiving a zero mark for that exam and will be noted on the exam paper

## APPEALS:

Any student wishing to appeal a sanction imposed for breaching exam rules must do so in writing to the Principal within five (5) school days. Appeal Forms are available from the Deputy Principal.

## ILLNESS AND MISADVENTURE:

Students unable to attend exam/s due to illness or misadventure should:

- 1. Inform the school as soon as possible, preferably prior to the exam
- 2. Collect and complete an 'Illness and/or Misadventure' form available from the Deputy Principal
- 3. Complete the form and return to the Principal within two school days along with documentary evidence (such as a Medical Certificate)

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
